**MEMORANDUM**

**TO:** Department Representatives Appointed under the Provisions of C.I.G. Directive #12, dated 7 June 1946.

**SUBJECT:** Interim Survey of the Adequacy of Intelligence Facilities Related to the National Security.

1. In accordance with the provisions contained in paragraph 4 of subject directive, it is requested that you submit in writing as a matter of urgency answers to the following questions:

a. What was the recommended strength of your intelligence structure to fulfill the requirements of your postwar mission shown by class as follows:

- (1) Officers.
- (2) Other military or naval personnel.
- (3) Professional civilians.
- (4) Other civilians.

b. What is the current authorized strength for intelligence activities in your department shown by the same categories as in a above?

c. What functions and activities of your recommended intelligence structure have been eliminated, delegated or curtailed by reduced authorizations?

d. What reduction in personnel authorizations are contemplated for your intelligence activities in the foreseeable future shown by categories as in a above?

e. The reductions indicated in question d will cause what further reduction, delegation, elimination, or curtailment of functions?

F. What reductions or eliminations of functions have been required in agencies under the purview of your departmental intelligence function and what is the effect upon the performance of your intelligence mission?

G. In considering all the foregoing factors is the proposed organization and strength adequate to meet your present mission as defined by your own department and H.I.A. policies?

H. If not, what additional personnel and facilities are required to meet this inadequacy?

I. What action do you recommend be taken by C.I.G. to remedy the situation?
