1. [redacted] John Martini, on the staff of the House Post Office and Civil Service Committee, called to say the Committee was sending to GPO for printing a "Summary Analysis of the President's Proposal for Reform of the Federal Statutory Salary System. (H. R. 10437)." Arrangements have been made directly with GPO for multiple copies of this document.

2. [redacted] Personnel, called to say [redacted] information on [redacted] a former Agency employee. I called [redacted] and advised him [redacted] had worked for the Agency only a short time and decided that she did not wish to work under the security restrictions involved in the Agency and, since she had not been with the Agency long enough to receive a fitness report, I could not comment in detail on her performance in the position to which she was assigned.

3. [redacted] Returned to Representative Albert H. Quie the book and pamphlets sent to him by his Soviet correspondent and indicated a definite interest in one book on [redacted] I suggested that the Congressman indicate his appreciation for these books and endeavor to obtain additional material of this type. I also indicated that we could see no reason why he should not send his report and that of the Special Education Committee to his contact.

4. [redacted] Met with Mr. Colgate Prentice, Administrative Assistant to Senator John Sherman Cooper, and advised him that we were
