Spy Didn't Work for Us

STOCKHOLM, Sweden, April 11 (UPI)—The U. S. embassy today formally denied reports that Swedish Col. Stig Wennerstroem, confessed spy for Russia, also worked for American intelligence.

Wennerstroem, 57, is on trial behind closed doors in Stockholm after having confessed he spied for the Kremlin for 15 years — five of them as a Swedish air attache in Washington.

Wennerstroem, a distinguished-looking air force staff officer who also served with the Swedish Embassy in Moscow, faces a maximum life prison sentence if convicted of charges that he sold Swedish and North Atlantic Treaty Organization defense secrets to the Soviet intelligence service.
