25X1 1. [redacted] Mr. Cannon sent word inquiring if the Director could make a meeting with the CIA Subcommittee of House Appropriations at ten o'clock tomorrow morning - 16 April 1964, in Room 128 A. Upon receiving appropriate word, Mr. Cannon's office was advised that this time was appropriate.

Later in the day I talked with Mr. Cannon explaining to him that while the Director would be able to be present for most of the meeting he would have to leave a little bit early since the President had scheduled a meeting of the National Security Council. Mr. Cannon said this was perfectly all right.

25X1 2. [redacted] Met with Chairman Vinson this morning and discussed a meeting with the Agency of the CIA Subcommittee of House Armed Services. Mr. Vinson suggested ten o'clock on Monday morning, 20 April. We contacted the Committee later to advise that the Agency would be happy to appear but that unfortunately the Director would be out of town but that General Carter would be available. Mr. Elandford is to advise if this makes any change in Mr. Vinson's thinking on the scheduled date. 25X1

25X1 4. [redacted] Jay Sourwine telephoned again asking if the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee could be provided with a copy of the white paper that Brazil is going to put out to explain the Goulart matter. I told him I would see that it was supplied.
