Mr. [REDACTED] ATTENDED MEETING OF THE R PROCEDURE SUBCOMMITTEE. DIATHERMY EQUIPMENT TUBES FOR FRENCH ZONE OF AUSTRIA WERE DENIED; eight applications for Austria, involving ALUMINUM OXIDE AND SILICON CARBIDE (for the manufacture of grinding wheels), WERE RETURNED WITHOUT ACTION BECAUSE OF AUSTRIA'S ESSENTIAL REQUIREMENTS FROM THE US HAVING ALREADY BEEN MET; AN EXPORT LICENSE APPLICATION FOR SHIPMENT TO SWEDEN OF AN OPTICAL TEMPERATURE MEASURING PYROMETER, used in testing ferroalloys, WAS WITHDRAWN PENDING ASSURANCES FROM THE SWEDISH GOVERNMENT AGAINST THE EXPORT OF FERROTUNGSTEN TO SOVIET DESTINATIONS; ACTION ON RADIO TUBES (value \$22,427) TO ITALY WAS DEFERRED PENDING RECEIPT OF ASSURANCES OF PURCHASES BY BONA FIDE ITALIAN CONSIGNEES; AUTOMOTIVE REPLACEMENT PARTS (value \$19,600) TO ITALY WERE DENIED BECAUSE OF DEROGATORY INFORMATION ON THE CONSIGNEE. Mr. [REDACTED], S/EP, again VISITED Mr. GRAVES OF the EXPORT-IMPORT BANK AND REVIEWED THE INFORMATION THAT Mr. GRAVES HAS BROUGHT BACK FROM SPAIN CONCERNING ELECTRIC POWER. THE INFORMATION IS COMPLETE AND UP TO DATE AND Mr. GRAVES INDICATED THAT THE SPANISH OFFICIALS WERE VERY COOPERATIVE IN SUPPLYING INFORMATION.
