The CIA REPRESENTATIVE ABSTAINED FROM taking a POSITION ON EXPORT QUOTAS for 1952 FOR AUSTRIA ON COPPER REFINERY SHAPES AND SCRAP, AND ARTIFICIAL GRAPHITE ELECTRODES.

THE DISCUSSION DEALT WITH the ECONOMIC SITUATION OF DENMARK IN GENERAL AND WITH the following questions of special interest to A/E: DENMARK'S continuing NEGOTIATIONS FOR POLISH COAL in the face of Poland's unrelenting insistence on bartering her coal against Danish deliveries of American-made automobile parts; DANISH EXPORT CONTROLS; the DANISH ATTITUDE IN COCOM meetings; DANISH LACK OF ENTHUSIASM FOR THE DEFENSE EFFORT.
