SUBJECT : Delay in Receipt of State Despatches

REFERENCE: Memorandum from Chief, East European Branch to Deputy Chief, Intelligence Information Staff dated

8 May 1961; same subject.

- 1. As requested, we have checked the time required in processing the 23 despatches listed in reference from the date "received in Mashington" by State Department to the date received in OCI.
- 2. The number of work days for processing varied in total from 4 to 13 the average being 9. It took 1 to 5 work days in State Department and 1 to 9 work days in CIA; the average being 3 and 6 work days, respectively.
- 3. We are making every effort to process the many types of reports we receive daily on a tight schedule; our goal is to disseminate copies to OCI within 1 to 2 work days after receipt. The reports do not come in on a regular basis and the changes in volume each day make it difficult to process them efficiently.

- of State despatches to be picked up by your messenger this morning were received in Washington at the State Department from 5 May to 13 May. This indicates that OCI is receiving their copies 2 to 7 work days after receipt in Washington.
- 5. We hope we can improve our service to GCI and welcome your continued check of the time taken to get this material to your office.
