5. [redacted] Checked with William Allen, Administrative Assistant to Senator Albert Gore (D., Tenn) to ascertain if he is aware of any requests the Senator has made on the Agency which have not been fulfilled. Allen said the Senator never informs him of any classified matters, and I would have to check with the Senator. Senator Gore is in Tennessee at the moment and I shall check with him on his return.

6. [redacted] Discussed with J. Garner Cline, Staff Director House Subcommittee on Immigration, the status of the Rodino Bill [redacted] The bill has now cleared Justice and is with [redacted] Cline expects that it will now move rapidly.

Checked on the status of the [redacted] [redacted] A new bill, [redacted] has been introduced and a report requested of [redacted] We shall ask Immigration to speed the report.

Checked on the status of the [redacted] bill. Cline said he would talk to Representative Rodino on this, following which we should also talk to Rodino. I shall follow up on this after hearing from Cline.

Discussed with Cline the question of whom we should ask to introduce a bill for [redacted] [redacted] In the circumstances of the case, Cline suggested Representative Frank Chelf (D., Ky) as the best person to approach.

7. [redacted] Spoke with Senator Thomas J. Dodd by way of follow up concerning a sweep of his office. The Senator said he would very much like to have this done and I told him we would be glad to be of assistance. Arrangements will be made with David Martin, of his staff. 25X1

Also talked with the Senator concerning [redacted] who has appeared with the Senator on [redacted] recently. I gave Senator Dodd some background information on [redacted] and at his request will provide him with some additional information. Arrangements for his "appearances" which were done by tape were made by the Senator's staff and the Senator is not at all familiar with [redacted] background.

8. [redacted] Handcarried to Mr. Russ Rourke, in the office of Representative Henry Smith, a 1959 [redacted] concerning Khrushchev's visit to the United States. This was provided in response to Rourke's earlier request.
