25X1 1. [redacted] Delivered the revised draft of the Rodino bill (H.R. 10400) to Mr. Cline of the House Subcommittee on Immigration and Naturalization.

25X1 Mr. Cline informed me that the hearings on the private bill for [redacted] will take place next week.

25X1 2. [redacted] Mr. Fred Mesmer of the Senate Subcommittee on Immigration and Naturalization informed me that the report from Immigration and Naturalization Service on the [redacted] reached the Subcommittee yesterday. I shall furnish Mr. Mesmer with a background information memorandum for the Subcommittee.

25X1 3. [redacted] Talked with David Martin, in the office of Senator Thomas J. Dodd, concerning his request for the name of the Agency representative who met Senator Dodd in [redacted] 1961. I advised Martin that this was probably either [redacted] 25X1 [redacted] Martin said he recalled seeing [redacted] but on reflection had decided that neither of these men had met the Senator's plane 25X1 upon his arrival in [redacted]

25X1 In connection with his inquiry concerning possible Agency assistance in the preparation of material by the [redacted] [redacted] I gave Martin a list of reliable publications already in existence in this field with the comment that it was the feeling of our people that since much had already been done in this field, it did not appear that much could be added at this time. I told Martin that we naturally wanted to cooperate to the extent possible but thought he would be interested in this initial reaction. Martin said he was interested in this and was happy to have the list.

25X1 4. [redacted] Mr. William Tabak, in the office of Senator Stephen Young, made several calls during the day seeking information on the dates of tenure of the various Directors of Central Intelligence. The information was provided to him.
