Under the country-X device, the bank opens a line of credit to the Defense Department' arms salesman, Henry J. Kuss Jr., which Mr. Kuss lends to the country involved for the arms purchase.

The loans are guaranteed by the Defense Department through! its \$383-million revolving arms sales credit fund under a law : that requires that only 25 percent of the loan must be covered by the fund.
