**Restraint Urged
By Allen Dulles

CHICAGO, Dec. 1. (Chicago Tribune Press Service) — Restraint in dealing with the insults of Russia and Red China was advocated last night by Allen W. Dulles, director of the Central Intelligence Agency and brother of Secretary of State John Foster Dulles.

The director spoke before the annual meeting of the University of Chicago Law School Alumni Association. The tenor of his speech was similar to that delivered here Monday night by his brother.

Pleading for coolness in critical times, Allen Dulles urged avoidance of the kind of thoughtless impatience or anger that could lead to a general atomic war."
