

# CIA's Dulles Tells of New Red Tactics

WASHINGTON, Sept. 1 (INS).

—The nation's intelligence chief warned Saturday that Italy, France and Indonesia are the main targets of new Communist infiltration tactics devised by the Kremlin.

Allen W. Dulles, director of the super-secret Central Intelligence Agency, described the new Red strategy as being that of "parliamentary conquest" in which the Reds try to infiltrate and take over legislative systems of free world nations.

His views were made public by the House Un-American Activities Committee which is conducting a study of new Soviet cold war techniques.

**DULLES, IN** a statement submitted to the committee, said the new Kremlin policy was spelled out by Communist boss Nikita S. Khrushchev in a speech before the 20th Party Congress in Moscow.

The CIA director quoted Khrushchev's remarks and said: "Translated into a little less flamboyant language, this means that the Communists propose to infiltrate our free legislative systems, to take over our parliamentary governments and use the freedom which our system of government gives to destroy all vestiges of that system."

**IN PINPOINTING** the situation, Dulles said:

"In the Italian parliament of 590 members, there are now 143 Communist members. To these must be added 75 Nenni fellow-traveling left-wing Socialists or a total of 218 who consistently vote and act with the Communists. Together, in the last election in 1953, their total popular vote was nine and a half millions or 35.5 percent of the total.

"In Indonesia, the Communist Party received six million votes or 17 percent of the total electorate in the elections of September, 1955, and they have a representation of 39 members or 15 percent of the total of the Indonesian assembly.

Dulles also noted that a recent Indonesian government "permitted Communist influence to reach far into the Ministry of Defense."

The CIA chief reported that while 35 countries have outlawed the Communist Party, rank-and-file members work through underground channels, and he added that in areas such as Singapore, "Communist-influenced parties have an important position and serve as effective vehicles for Communist activity."

In conclusion, Dulles declared: "The Kremlin leaders have told us what they propose to do. It is up to the leaders of the free world, working together as allies and friends, to help to uncover and to frustrate this Communist design, which otherwise could threaten to wreck the free institutions of many countries and even endanger our own."
