# Diplomats Predict Hungary Uprising

Washington—(INS)—Top diplomatic sources are privately dropping the word to expect the next big uprising against Communist bosses in Hungary.

Although cloak-and-dagger central intelligence officials are following the State Department line that the bloody Polish riots were "spontaneous uprisings" without American prompting, it is interesting to remember this:

Nearly two months ago, C.I.A. Director Allen Dulles predicted that Communist party boss Matyas Rakosi of Hungary was on his way out. London sources are now making the identical predictions concerning the Red dictator who incurred the wrath not only of the new Russian leaders, but also of Yugoslav Marshal Tito by clinging too long to the Stalinist line.

Top administration leaders believe it is not likely that Poznan-type uprisings may erupt in other places in Poland and in neighboring Russian satellites.

Allen Dulles, who returned last week from the Eniwetok hydrogen bomb testing grounds, has been expecting trouble for the Reds in Hungary for some time.

As exclusively reported by this correspondent in mid-May, Dulles said Rakosi—the one-time Stalin stooge who masterminded the Communist seizure of Hungary—was now "trembling in his boots" because of his "precarious" hold on his power-hungry job.

Not only are Communists shaken by the horrifying revelations of Stalin's depravity and blood lust, but also by
