

Allen Dulles to Lay Stone At Georgetown Presbyterian

<p>Allen W. Dulles, director of the Central Intelligence Agency, will lay the cornerstone for the restored Georgetown Presbyterian Church during a service at 11 a.m. tomorrow.</p>	<p>Rev. Albert J. <p>The building at 3115 P street N.W. was built in 1821, 41 years after the church's founding in 1780. The original cornerstone was laid in 1821 by President James Monroe and that of an 1873 addition by President U. S. Grant.</p>	<p>In addition to the restoration of the 1821 building, the congregation is erecting a recreational and educational building adjacent to the sanctuary. Total cost of the project will be some \$450,000.</p>
