(ALLEN DULLES)

CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE DIRECTOR ALLEN D. DULLES SAID TODAY THE POLISH AND HUNGARIAN UPRISINGS REVEALED SOVIET WEAKNESSES WHICH SURPRISED BOTH THE KREMLIN LEADERS AND THE FREE WORLD.

THE BLOODY SUPPRESSION OF THE HUNGARIAN REVOLUTION BY THE RUSSIAN ARMY SUGGESTS, DULLES SAID, THAT "WE MAY BE BACK AGAIN TO THE DAYS OF RUTHLESS STALINISM."

DULLES SAID IN A SPEECH TO THE AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF LAND GRANT COLLEGES AND STATE UNIVERSITIES THAT THE SOVIET DICTATORSHIP CONTAINS THE SEEDS OF ITS OWN DESTRUCTION.

"THE GREATEST DANGER WHICH A COMMUNIST DICTATORSHIP FACES TODAY," DULLES SAID, "IS THE UPRISING OF YOUTH AGAINST TYRANNY. NO AMOUNT OF BASIC URGE TO ASSERT THE RIGHT OF FREE EXPRESSION."

DULLES SAID THAT MANY IN THE FREE WORLD AS WELL AS THE MEN IN THE KREMLIN HAVE BEEN OVER-IMPRESSED BY RUSSIA'S OBVIOUSLY GREAT ARMED MIGHT. WHAT HAPPENED IN POLAND AND HUNGARY REVEALED WEAKNESSES "WHICH MANY EVEN IN THE FREE WORLD DID NOT ANTICIPATE."

AND THE SOVIET RULES, HE SAID, MUST HAVE FIGURED THAT THE SATELLITES AFTER 10 YEARS OF "IRON DISCIPLINE" WERE SAFELY UNDER CONTROL.

BUT "BY THEIR ARDENT PURSUIT OF FREEDOM, YOUTHS IN POLAND, HUNGARY, AND ELSEWHERE" ARE PROVING THEY PREFER FREEDOM TO TYRANNY, DULLES SAID.

DULLES SAID THE HARDEST JOB OF THE CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE AGENCY IS TO DISCOVER ANOTHER COUNTRY'S INTENTIONS. IN THE CASE OF HUNGARY, HE SAID, THE UNITED STATES KNEW WHAT FORCES THE RUSSIANS COULD USE IF THEY DECIDED, AS THEY DID, "TO TAKE THE COURSE OF RUTHLESS REPRESSION."

AT FIRST, THE RUSSIANS INDICATED A TOLERANT ATTITUDE TOWARD THE HUNGARIAN REVOLT AND, DULLES, SAID, "IT SEEMED THAT A MIRACLE HAD HAPPENED."

BUT THE MEN IN THE KREMLIN "REACHED THE CONCLUSION THAT THEIR CONTROL NOT ONLY IN HUNGARY BUT THROUGHOUT THE WHOLE SOVIET DOMAIN WAS AT STAKE."

IF WHAT THEY DID THEN "IS ANY GUIDE TO WHAT MAY HAPPEN IN THE USSR," DULLES SAID, "WE MAY BE BACK AGAIN TO THE DAYS OF RUTHLESS STALINISM."

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
