It certainly was a pleasure to see you again the day before yesterday.

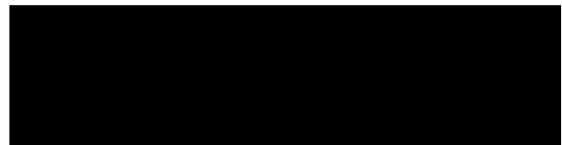
