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NARRATIVE SUPPLEMENT TO THE
CIA ARCHIVES AND RECORDS CENTER
MONTHLY STATISTICAL SUMMARY FOR MARCH 1965

1. The Archives and Records Center accessioned 877 cubic feet of records from Headquarters components.
2. Disposition action was taken on 1,356 cubic feet of records. This is the third consecutive month that the Disposition actions have been more than the Accessions.
3. The total holdings of the Archives and Records Center now amounts to 83,935 cubic feet, of which 2,639 are in the Region #3 Federal Records Center.
4. There were 12,182 reference items furnished to the Agency and other USIB agencies. The reference work has increased for the third consecutive month and was 50 per cent more in March than it was in December. This increase in reference has caused a curtailment of some of the Archival work, re-quirement to the Federal Records Center and other programs.
5. A Request for 11 archival documents was received from the U.S. Army R&D Operations Research Advisory Group. This is the first time that CIA archives have been loaned to another agency.
