MISCUSSION OF THE ORGANIZATION OF WORK ON THE SOVIET ARCTIC AND THE SPECIFIC INTERESTS

OF THE VARIOUS 120/1 COMPONENTS CONCERNED

Miscussion: The organization of research and intelligence production on the Soviet Arctic in the DD/Area, as described in the chart distributed prior to the meeting, was discussed. The representatives of the various shops explained their specific interests in the field. The representatives of OCI pointed out that their interests differed from those of the other Offices since their Office is a consumer rather than a producer of intelligence. It needs a mechanism through which it could obtain immediately evaluation of and useful comments on spot reports from all interested CIA components. The only way in which OCI serves as a producer of Arctic intelligence for CIA is in its access to military information. Military Division, CCI, is the only CIA component which holds such information and has channels for obtaining it. OCI can thus fill gaps resulting from CIA's lack of coverage in these fields.

In view of the fact that the term "Soviet Arctic" is defined differently by the various shops concerned, it was suggested that the Arctic Group should begin its activities with the drafting of a definition which could be applied throughout the DD/I Area.

2. Action: D/GG/S (ORR) was requested and agreed to submit, prior to the next meeting, a definition of the term "Soviet Arctic" which all components of the ID/I Area could use.

MISCUSSION OF THE QUESTION HOW THE DD/I AREA CAN BEST MARSHAL ITS RESOURCES TO OBTAIN BALANCED INTELLIGENCE ON THE SOVIET ARCTIC AND TO CORRECT DEFICIENCIES

- 1. Discussion: The meeting entered into a discussion of the following specific questions: Exchange of information; lateral notification of the status of work in progress, feasibility of cooperative effort on certain problems; methods for recognizing deficiencies that can be corrected by work in the ED/I Area; and the type of mechanism by which these questions could be most appropriately answered.
- 2. Action: It was agreed (1) that the Group should examine the present and contemplated programs of intelligence research and production in the ID/I components, discover and remove gaps in operation and planning, and act as a central agency facilitating the work of the various shops, (2) that, to facilitate the performance of these tasks, one person designated by the Group should be available as a "clearing house" for exchange of information and handling of requests by interested persons, and (3) that the Group should work out methods to correct deficiencies discovered in its survey of the state of Soviet Arctic intelligence, research, and planning. There was general agreement that the discussion of further details should be postponed and the proposed agenda for the meeting on h and 5 October be



Although this vast territory includes some areas where natural conditions are not strictly Arctic, it best represents the region in which activities of an Arctic nature are largely concentrated. Where expedient, micro-geographic areas not a part of the major territory, or transitional areas adjacent to the territory may be included to form a functional unit."

RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE AD HOC GROUP ON SOVIET ARCTIC INTELLIGENCE

It is recommended:

- 1. That a single permanent DD/I Group on Soviet Arctic Intelligence be formed within the DD/I area, to consist of one principle representative each from OSI, OCI, ERA/RR and GRA/RR.
- 2. That one of the members of this Group shall act as its chairman. The chairmanship shall be rotated between ORR and OSI representatives pericically by mutual agreement.
- 3. That a list shall be prepared and thereafter be maintained on all projects completed or in process in the DD/I area, which deal exclusively or to a substantial extent with the Soviet Arctic, and that this list shall contain the following: (a) Project Designation (Number), (b) Classification, (c) Title, (d) Brief Description of Contents as far as the Soviet Arctic is concerned, (e) Acting Unit, (f) Author(s), (g) Due Date or Target Date, (h) Date of Submission, (i) Date of Publication or other end use, (j) Form of Publication or Place of Availability. Each of the members of the Group shall initially prepare a list of the projects completed or in process at his Office, or Area, with the above breakdowns, and send the master copy of its list to the chairman of the Group and a carbon copy to each other member. In order to keep these lists up to date at all times, each member shall notify immediately all other members and the Group Chairman of any new project or any change in the status of any project. The master list maintained by the chairman will be considered the official list of DD/I projects on the Soviet Arctic and will be available at all times to anyone inside or outside of the DD/I area.
 - 4. In addition to the above the Group shall have the following functions:
- a. An Office receiving a request for a research project or study which is primarily concerned with the Soviet Arctic and requires contributions from more than one DD/I Office, will normally notify the Chairman of the Group on Soviet Arctic Intelligence who, thereupon, shall have the duty to call a meeting of the Group and/or, upon request by the receiver of the assignment or upon his own motion, to take, in cooperation with the Offices or sub-units concerned, other steps required to facilitate and expedite compliance with the request.
- b. The Office receiving the request shall be responsible for integrating contributions into a single DD/I product and for coordination within the DD/I area. Any other necessary coordination shall be accomplished by the appropriate contributing offices.
- c. The Group will handle such other assignments on the Soviet Arctic as may be required.
