 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 That paragraph (1) of section 1701 (a) of title 38, United
 - 4 States Code, is amended by adding at the end thereof the
 - 5 following new sentence: "The term 'eligible child' also
 - 6 means a child of a civilian officer or employee of the United

- 6 38, United States Code, solely by virtue of the amendments

- 9 years on the date of enactment of this Act, the period referred
