- 1. This memorandum is for information only.
- 2. It is noteworthy that no publicity whatsoever has appeared in the domestic press this morning, among the nine metropolitan papers head here, on yesterday's open hearings by the House Rules Committee on the "Joint stelligence Committee" bills. Similarly, the press was almost entirely quistiont yesterday; only one item was seen -- the SCRIPPS-MOMARD piece by Jim G. Lucas buried in the back pages (p. 18) of the WASHINGTON DATLY NEWS, 2 Mar 1961. (Clipping of latter item appears in today's press book.)
- 3. Only one press inquiry, furthermore, has been received at Colonel Grogan's office this week on this matter-a quary from the MM YORK TOTALS (Ben Franklin) on 1 March, asking about "IIA's general accountability to Congress. I told Mr. Franklin of the Intelligence subcommittees of the four stand as committees of the two houses of Congress (Appropriations and Armed Services), and of the fact that the Director appears before other Congressional Committees, as well, on request.
