13. [redacted] Met with Senator J. W. Fulbright and delivered to him a response from Mr. Helms thanking the Senator for his kind note of congratulations. Senator Fulbright said he thought this was a most gracious note and he was happy to have it.

I then briefed him on the Truth About Cuba Committee utilizing the attached briefing sheet. Fulbright was completely satisfied so long as neither the Agency nor the Government was supporting this financially.

For another half hour Senator Fulbright discussed his views about the Administration's handling of relations with Russia and Cuba. I gave no views on these topics whatsoever indicating that these were foreign policy matters between the White House and the Department of State. He did offer his own view that the Consular Convention with the Soviet Union could not be approved this year indicating that the Vietnam war was a big factor in the situation.

Senator Fulbright expressed his regret concerning the McCarthy resolution that the press and many other people took the position that those who were supporting the resolution were in fact attacking CIA. I indicated that personally I understood this completely as I am sure most of the people in the Agency did. He gave no indication when this might come on the floor or whether it would.
