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1. [redacted] JGO) Mr. O'Neill accompanied [redacted] [redacted] to an informal discussion with Representative Ogden Reid (R., N.Y.). Mr. Reid expressed his appreciation for the meeting.

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2. [redacted] JSW) Met with William Darden and William Woodruff, of Senate Armed Services Committee staff, with [redacted] [redacted] for about two hours. They were briefed in great detail on the Agency budget including expenditures made from funds made available from other departments. They were most appreciative of the briefing and seemed to understand the general picture.

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3. (Internal Use Only - JSW) Met with Senator Paul J. Fannin and discussed with him briefly and in general terms the Agency's interest in H.R. 10721, the amendments to the Federal Employees' Compensation Act. He seemed favorably disposed to this legislation and was appreciative of our interest. He initiated the conversation on the current resolution to modify the CIA Subcommittee structure.)

4. (Internal Use Only - JSW) Representative John S. Monagan came to breakfast at the Agency. Present were: Admiral Raborn, [redacted] [redacted] Peer deSilva, William Colby, George McManus and John S. Warner. There was considerable discussion of the Vietnam situation and Communist China. Mr. Monagan seemed most interested and appreciative of the discussion.

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5. [redacted] LLM) Delivered to Senate Foreign Relations, the Committee's copy of the 25 and 28 February transcript of the Director's testimony per the request of Mr. Carl Marcy, Staff Director.

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25X1 6. [redacted] Distributed to the Senate members of our subcommittees the new page 2 of the analysis on the recent floor statements on the McCarthy resolution.

[redacted] Spoke with Gladys Johnson, Senate Committee on Post Office and Civil Service, on the Federal Employees pay bill and she advised that they plan to report it out of the Committee today and confirmed that the effective date of the early retirement provisions would not be changed and would be as of the date of enactment.

25X1 8. [redacted] Met with the staff personnel of Senate Preparedness including Jim Kendall and Glenn Smith. They outlined the planned program of hearings and studies and furnished me with a copy of the outline. They stated it was their purpose to do an in-depth study of world-wide commitments of the U.S. The outline has a section devoted to assessment of the threat which they would want the Agency to address itself to in a series of hearings. They inquired if I would discuss this with the various Agency components involved to see if any particular problems appeared. I advised I would be in touch next week.
