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- 7. (Unclassified GLC) Talked with the office of Representative William V. Roth (R., Del.) regarding their request to FBIS that the FBIS books formerly sent to William Sullivan, in the Congressman's office, should now be sent to him at his private address since he has left the staff. I explained the FBIS policy which precluded sending the books to Sullivan at his home and this seemed to create no problems for them. We will cancel these subscriptions.
- 8. (Secret GLC) Accompanied Bruce Clarke, OSR, to a briefing of Senator Thomas J. McIntyre (D., N.H.) on the Soviet SS-9 program. The Senator said his interest stemmed from references to this program by Secretary of Defense Laird in a congressional briefing several months ago. The Senator was primarily interested in whether there had been any new starts since August of last year.
- 9. (Internal Use Only LLM) Handcarried to Victor Zafra, Bureau of the Budget, the Agency's proposed report to Chairman Henderson, Manpower and Civil Service Subcommittee, House Post Office and Civil Service Committee, on S. 782. Zafra said he had already received word of Mr. Maury's call to Roger Jones, BOB, and in response to my question said that in the event they had not cleared our report by the time it was needed by Henderson, we could transmit it with the standard statement that time did not permit BOB clearance. He said, however, they would move fast on it and foresaw no problems in early clearance. BOB has not yet received reports on the bill from any other department or agency. I told him we understood that Henderson had requested the views of the Civil Service Commission and Department of Defense. Zafra was surprised to learn that the FBI had retained its full exemption and I suggested that Justice's views might still be desirable since they will be required to defend all suits generated by the bill.
