I queried Dorothy Fosdick, on the staff of the Senate Subcommittee on
National Security and International Operations, about the possible
appearance of Leonard Shapiro before the Subcommittee. Miss Fosdick
said Shapiro was tentatively scheduled to appear before the Subcommittee

25X1 5. [redacted] Met with Dorothy Fosdick, Staff Director,
Subcommittee on National Security and International Operations, whom I
briefed on the Middle East situation, and Soviet naval activities in the
Mediterranean.

Miss Fosdick expressed particular interest in the Soviet leadership
situation, and said that the Subcommittee was planning to hear testimony
by Leonard Shapiro (prominent British Kremlinologist) in the next week or
two.

25X1 Miss Fosdick asked whether we could provide a copy of a letter from
the Soviet scientist [redacted] complaining to the leadership about its present
policies. She was also interested in our views about the authenticity and
significance of the letter.
