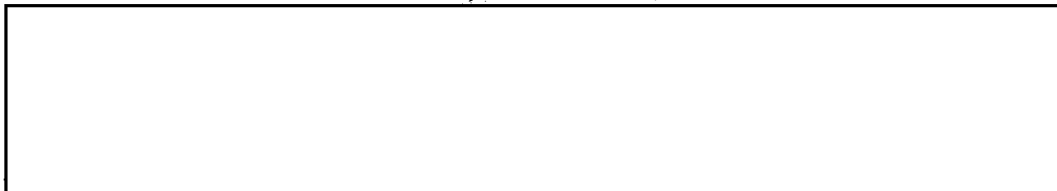

1. John Bross is going to contact Howard Osborn on the damage assessment of the Johnson case. This is in connection with presentation to the President's Foreign Intelligence Advisory Board.



3. Bud Wheelon talked to  and outlined the job to him. It closely resembles an executive officer and is part of a complete re-organization of OSA. Brad will have Finance, Audit, Logistics, Personnel, and Security under him, and, according to Brad, he will also have a discussionary authority to report directly to Wheelon rather than through the Director of OSA.
