The Angry Retort

To the Editor, Evening Post:

In reply to Mrs. Russell Fitzwater's letter (Forum, Aug. 31), I can fully agree that reading "None Dare Call It Treason" could make any American citizen angry. The allegations are most certainly of a nature to support the author's contention of widespread disloyalty among government officials.

If the charges are provable, then they should be formally presented to a federal grand jury. But, if the allegations are figments of the author's hallucinations, then they should not be taken seriously.

One thing further: The party in power when Castro's forces advanced on Havana was not the Democratic party. Republicans occupied the office of President, with all attendant authority afforded that office including complete control of the State Department, the CIA and all the military services of the United States. With the authority of the executive branch of the United States government, Batista was ordered not to oppose the "popular revolution" of the Cuban people and to allow Castro to take over the Cuban nation.

The practice of ridiculing existing democratic governments throughout the world seems to be the prelude to Communist takeovers. It has happened in Cuba, China, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Estonia, Latvia, Poland, and numerous smaller countries.

Is the angry retort to irresponsible writing going to enslave America?
