## Communist Opponents Incorporate

FAIRFAX—A certificate of incorporation of a stock company has been issued to Anti-Communist Liason, Inc. by the State Corporation Commission.

Approved articles were received Thursday by the clerk of the Fairfax County Court for the organization to be headed initially by three directors. Plans call for issuing 20,000 shares of common stock at a par value of \$1.00 per share.

DIRECTORS are Edward Hunter, 320 N. George Mason Drive, Arlington; Miss Edith Kermit Roosevelt, 800 4th St., N.W.; Washington, D.C.; and Mrs. William D. Potts, of Tucson, Arizona.

Purpose of the company is "to produce educational materials designed to conserve and strengthen the American principles on which our Republic was founded and prospered and which uphold the dignity and individuality of man."

The charter also speaks of a need to "analyze and explain the tactics and strategies that constitute propaganda pressures and psychological warfare as practiced by the Communists."

THE GROUP hopes to "guide, train and alert others to assume a positive role in preserving our constitutional check and balance system of government."

Mrs. Roosevelt is the granddaughter of President Theodore Roosevelt and the author of a right wing column.

Permission has been granted for the company to engage in manufacturing or merchandizing "any article or thing which the corporation uses in connection with its business."
