**NEW GROUP ON CHINA
GETS CALL TO DEBATE**

The Committee of One Million, a nationwide, bipartisan organization opposed to the admission of Communist China to the United Nations, called yesterday on the newly formed National Committee on United States-China Relations for a constructive and honest debate.

The latter group, headed by Dr. Robert A. Scalapino of the University of California, urges high-level debate but will take no formal positions as an organization. It is seeking tax-exemption status as a nonprofit educational organization.

Carl F. Stover, a spokesman for the new organization welcomed the idea of widespread discussion and debate.

"Because we do not take positions we are not able to engage in advocative debate with committee," he said. "But we would be happy to talk with them on jointly arranging public meetings at which issues can be debated."

It is possible, he added, that some members of his organiza-

tion would debate with representatives of the Committee of One Million, but speaking only as individuals.

Dr. Scalapino's committee describes itself as having a wide spectrum of opinion on China policy, but the views of its members are for the most part opposite to those taken by the Committee of One Million, according to the later group.
