## Buckley Group Plans Warren Report Study

The Historic Research Foundation, an organization associated with conservative causes, announced yesterday it was planning a \$2,000 grant to study the Warren Commission Report on President Kennedy's assassination.

A foundation spokesman said the idea for the study originated with William F. Buckley Jr., editor of the National Review and one of the foundation's trustees. Buckley was quoted as saying the evaluation of the report would be made "for the sake of the public tranquility."

The foundation was set up by the late Alfred Kohlberg, a tex-

tile importer, who was a leading member of the China lobby in the U.S. after the expulsion of Chiang Kai-shek from the Chinese mainland.

The foundation's announcement coincided with the publication of a fourth book critical of the Warren Report, "The Second Oswald," by Prof. Richard H. Popkin, chairman of the philosophy department of the University of California.
