**REPORTERS' GROUP
TO GIVE AWARDS TO 6**

The Newspaper Reporters Association of New York City named yesterday six reporters of three metropolitan newspapers as winners of annual Byline Awards for outstanding journalistic achievement.

McCandlish Phillips and Charles Grutzner of The New York Times will receive the association's feature and business news awards.

Mr. Phillips was cited for his story headed, "State Klan Leader Hides Secret of Jewish Origin." Mr. Grutzner was cited for disclosure of the Mafia's inroads into business.

Barrett McGurn of The New York Herald Tribune won the

spot news award for his report on Pope Paul's visit to New York. Martin Steadman and Dom Bonafede of the same paper won the Schaefer Gold Typewriter award for their series, "Out Sideline. Congressmen."

Sally Hammond of The New York Post will receive the cultural award for articles dealing with great artists of history.

In addition to the Byline Awards, \$100 awards sponsored by the Uniformed Firemen's Association with the newsmen's association will be made to Peter McLaughlin and Mary O'Flaherty Amy of The New York Daily News and to The Staten Island Advance.

The date and place of the presentation of the plaques have not yet been set.
