## JOHNSON NAMES FIVE AS SCIENCE ADVISERS

WASHINGTON, March 21 (AP)—President Johnson announced today the appointment of five new members to four-year terms on his Science Advisory Committee. He then met with the committee.

Dr. Sidney D. Drell, professor of physics, Stanford University.

William R. Hewlett, president, Hewlett-Packard Company, Palo Alto, Calif.

Dr. Charles P. Slichter, professor of physics, University of Illinois.

Dr. Charles H. Townes, provost, Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Dr. Edward M. Purcell, professor of physics, Harvard University.
