COLLEGIAN ASSAILS U. S. OVER VIETNAM

PHILADELPHIA, April 14—
The leader of a student committee at Haverford College explained Tuesday that money was being collected for medical supplies for the Communist Vietcong because his group felt the United States was supporting a totalitarian government in South Vietnam.

The leader, Russell D. Stetler Jr., a 19-year-old Philadelphian, also charged that the United States was suppressing the Vietnamese people's fight for freedom by "financing military leaders for whom there is no popular support."

The student group, known as the Student Committee to Send Medical Aid to the Front of National Liberation of South Vietnam, was founded at Haverford last month by Mr. Stetler and four other students: Joseph Eyer, 19, of Philadelphia; Roger Eaton, 19, of Lexington, Mass.; Paul Mattick Jr., 19, of Boston, and James Garahan, 18, of Woodside, Queens.

Mr. Stetler said similar committees, with a membership of about 50, were now functioning at Harvard, Yale, Columbia, the University of Pennsylvania, New York University, Swarthmore, Smith and Bennington.

The committee wants the United States to stop sending military aid to South Vietnam and to withdraw all troops there, Mr. Stetler said.
