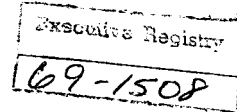

1. As you are aware, the DCI, with USIB concurrence, designated [] as CIAC, effective 13 February 1969. This function has been progressing well and has been generally well received in the community and supported in the Agency. Word on appointments of this kind, however, never quite gets to all levels of the Agency or tends to get lost in the rush of business as usual. Accordingly, I think it would be helpful to have an Agency Notice issued, spelling out the responsiveness we need from all echelons in support of the CIAC, and indicating that the CIAC function can in turn assist those offices.

2. A draft of such a notice is attached. I would appreciate your concurrence or comments.

3. For your information I am also attaching a copy of USIB-D-58.1/9, of 14 February 1969, which gives the text of the CIAC's charter.

1. The Director of Central Intelligence (DCI) on 6 April 1966 approved the attached Terms of Reference for [redacted] as China Intelligence Activities Coordinator (CIAC) to provide a more precise statement of the actions which the DCI expects to occur with regard to improving our intelligence status on China, supplementary to his USIB statement in reference a. Copies of the attachment have been transmitted by the DCI to USIB principals by memorandum dated 9 May 1966.

X1 1. In line with our recent conversation, I would appreciate your officially appointing [] of my Staff, as DCI China Intelligence Activities Coordinator (CIAC), vice [] [] If convenient with your schedule, I would suggest the next meeting of the USIB as an appropriate occasion to seek its concurrence, [] authority to date from that time or from, say, 1 February. 25X

X1 2. As we discussed, [] would be guided by the same CIAC Terms of Reference (Reference c) which has previously obtained. A copy of this Terms of Reference is enclosed as Attachment A.

3. You may wish to inform the Board that you desire [] to give particular, continuing attention to the problems (1) of the United States intelligence effort against Chinese Communist strategic weapons; (2) of defining the Chinese target and clarifying what services United States intelligence can reasonably be expected to perform with respect thereto; and, overall (3), of drawing to the attention of the DCI and the USIB steps which might be taken to eliminate deficiencies or effect improvements in the United States intelligence efforts against Communist China. 25X

X1 4. Also, I would suggest that you request each Member of the Board to name a specific senior China affairs officer in his Agency with whom [] may deal in carrying out his responsibilities.

X1 5. You may recall that the previous Terms of Reference (Reference c) initially occasioned some minor concern from General Carter as to whether [] authority might not supersede existing lines of command. Admiral Raborn's reply seemed to put that to rest.* In any event, [] was not inhibited in any way in the subsequent carrying out of his China responsibilities, and nothing further was heard from General Carter or anyone else on the subject. I anticipate no difficulty at all this time at USIB. 25X

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SUBJECT: DCI China Coordinator Responsibilities

A. DCI China Coordinator responsibilities: (USIB-D-58.1/3:
Republication of statement of DCI at 1 July 1965 USIB meeting)

1. Continuously monitor and review the Intelligence Community's collective efforts against Communist China.
2. Keep the DCI and the USIB informed of the programs and actions of member agencies concerning Communist China.
3. Recommend to the DCI and the USIB measures for improvement, both with regard to positive actions which might be taken and as to elimination of unwarranted duplication of the community's efforts.
4. Assist the DCI in fulfilling his responsibilities (see below) with respect to intelligence activities against Communist China.

B. DCI responsibilities: (NSCID No. 1)

1. Coordinate foreign intelligence activities of the US in accordance with existing law and applicable NSC directives. Such coordination shall include both special and other forms of intelligence which together constitute the foreign intelligence activities of the US. (para. 1)
2. Act for the NSC to provide implementation of the NSCIDs. (para. 3a)
3. Establish general guidance and specific priorities for production of national and other intelligence and for collection and other support activities. (para 3b(1))
4. Establish policy, procedures, and practices for maintenance of a continuous interchange of intelligence, intelligence information, and other information with utility for intelligence purposes. (para. 3b(2))

5. Establish policy, procedures, and practices for production or procurement of intelligence related to the national security. (para. 3b(3))

6. DCI, or representatives designated by him shall make surveys of departmental intelligence activities as necessary in connection with his duty to advise NSC and coordinate intelligence effort of the US. (para. 3c)

C. National intelligence is that intelligence which is required for formulation of national security policy, concerns more than one department, and transcends the exclusive competence of a single agency. (para. 4a; NSCID No. 1)
