MEMORANDUM FOR: Assistant Deputy Director for Intelligence

SUBJECT : Summary of IAS Workload - October 1970

1. This report summarizes the current work of the Imagery Analysis Service. At the end of October the Service had [] personnel. This included [] imagery analysts, [] graphic illustrators and [] intelligence assistants for a total of [] personnel contributing directly to imagery analysis and reporting, plus [] personnel performing management and support functions. The time of nine imagery analysts on PCS assignment to DDP is not included in this summary.

2. Our workload is described in the attached four tables. Table 1 compares the time expended by all personnel in October with similar data for the preceding five months. It also compares the workload on hand for the next three months, on imagery analysis and reporting only, with similar data for the preceding five months. Tables 2-4 show time expended and workload on hand for imagery analysis and reporting only according to geographic area, subject, and requester respectively.

3. No new KH imagery was received by IAS during October, but we did receive imagery on five GS missions. The 162 manhours expended this month on preliminary assessment and assimilation was much less than for any month in CY 70.

4. The Middle East crisis required considerably less time in October. As reflected in the accompanying tables, 1800 manhours were expended this month as compared to 3300 in September. Time on the USSR decreased primarily because there was no KH preliminary assessment. China time went up to parity with the USSR because of increased emphasis on currently active projects and new October inputs.
