STAT [] DMI -- INVASION RUMOR, HARRIMAN STORY

STAT SJC called [] and asked if he had or knew who did have a copy of the Harri-
STAT man story supposedly sent to CIA in Washington by LIFE. [] said he did not
have a copy and did not know who did.

STAT SJC passed on to [] the two pieces of information he had received from
STAT Warner of the TRIBUNE and [] agreed to pass this on to Sheldon.

CRENSHAW, WF -- INVASION RUMOR

SJC passed on to Crenshaw the two pieces of information received from Jim Warner. Crenshaw asked if there was any indication as to Warner's source. SJC said there was not and that he would not ask him his source. Crenshaw said they have similar rumors to this effect coming from the Embassy and also from our own people. He said if SJC heard any additional information he would be very much interested in getting it and gave his phone number as DU 7-0666 or AD 4-8895.

DICK WILSON, COWLES PUBLICATIONS -- invasion rumor

SJC passed on the information about the possibility of an invasion mounted from Cuba on the Dominican Republic.

JULIUS FRANDSEN, UPI -- KHRUS 29 JUNE SPEECH

SJC told Frandsen he had 30 takes worth of Khrushchev's speech if UPI wanted it. Frandsen said they did not.

JACK THORN, CR -- MOSCOW BROADCAST IN ARABIC, APR 29

Thorn said he had a copy of a Moscow broadcast in arabic commenting on Mr. Dulles' testimony on Iraq, dated 29 April. He asked if SJC would like a copy. SJC said he would and Thorn said he would send one up.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIARY

Mr. Dulles told Mr. Amory that he, Amory was not to see any press unless Col. Grogan was present. Mr. Amory later told me that he would not accept any more luncheon invitations from Hansen Baldwin and he certainly would not see him or any one else in his office unless I were present.
