LEWIS: "Tenight, ladies and gentlemen, I want to begin for you a series of reports on a very important subject, involving an operation that calls itself the Free Europe Committee, into which I have been conducting a personal investigative job for you for some months. Dast. It has been a very time-consuming and perhaps more difficult story than I have ever undertaken because of the road blocks that have been thrown in my way and the attempts that have been made to bring influence to bear through various powerful sources.

"I have a so-called guidance, or directive, issued by the organisation to its editors and general personnel, the authenticity of which the organisation attempts to deny, but which I am prepared to prove by a number of witnesses who were in the organisation in March of 1956 when it was issued, which instructs personnel to go easy on any criticism of communism or communists as such, and to play up Tito as a great national here who has saved his country from foreign barbarians.

"I have personal records on many of the propaganda planners and broadcasters, plus the directing and administrative stoffs in New York, showing who these people are, who they were before they were taken into this organization, what their experience is, or lack of it, and from their writing and speeches, what they believe in and what they are telling the people they reach.

"It's a story of original good includious in an operation that could have been immensely constructive, had it been operated by sound and legitimate heads, but which has become so remote at the operational level from those who sponsor it and stand responsible to the public for it, at the top level, as to be a travesty.

"Without introduction, let's proceed with the story. The origin of all this was back in the late forties, 1949, to be exact, when the Crusade For Freedom was set up, under the sponsorship of then-General Dwight D. Now, I have read you this list in full, so as to avoid any possible accusation of having selected some names and omitting others, the importance of the list being that it comes from the Crusade For Freedom itself, provides an authentic example of the people who are selected for these junkets. I question the propriety of using Truth Dollars for the hauth project, and I have the following explanations from the Crusade Itself. These are direct quotes:

PRODUCTION THE ENTROPE WELCOMES INSPECTION by all responsible people, which is the each year the Crusade sponsors a trip to view the operation for 60 top American opinion leaders; also, no part of the Crusade for Freedom collections go towards the Munich trip. All contributions to the Crusade to the penny are turned over to the Free Europe Committee. The cost of the trip is figured into the annual budget of the Crusade For Freedom, paid by private sources. The trip does not spend four days in Faris. The group arrives Friday afternoon, spends most of Saturday at a top level briefing at SHAPE headquarters and takes off for New York on Sunday. The explanation about the financing of the trip may interest you. The fact is, of course, this is hair-splitting as between Truth Dollar contributions and other contributions. If the trip were eliminated, that much money would be saved for the Free Europe operation, and which pocket it comes out of means nothing.

"Illi have more news for you now in just one minute.

There were 50 persons in all on this year's junket, and the Crusade says all expenses were not paid. They say, quote, group members pay for expenses and all meals other than official dinners and lunches. In the case of William G. Brunder, chairman of the Wisconsin National Bank, he paid all his own expenses and did not take the trip on the chartered plane in either direction. In any case, no contributions are used to finance any portions of the trip, unquote. This, after just having told what portions of the junket the Crusade does finance. Apparently, Mr. Brunder felt some uneasiness about accepting the trip. That's the top of the news as it looks from here.
