> It was at about this time that President Eisenhower agreed to hold a three-power conference with Prime Minister Eden and Premier Mollet in Washington to repair some of the damage done by the Suez mess. When Hoover learned of this he communicated with Socretary Dulles in Walter Reed Hospital, and Dulles persunded the President to withdraw the invitation aiready extended to Eden.

Hoover's and Dulle's strategy was partly to curry favor with the Arab world, partly to punish the French and British for acting without consulting the United States. This incidentally, was one reason the French and British got so sore when Duffes in Paris last week reserved the right to act without consulting our Allies .- (@1956)
