The press account provides the first information that the Embassy has received about two of the three incidents. Mr. Mill did not or was not able to contact the Embassy to report the difficulties he encountered with Soviet customs authorities. The Embassy has previously reported the Popova case. (Moscow 4457, August 10, 1970.)
