Says Cold War Made Aid To Students Necessary

Washington, Feb. 15-"That' when the cold war really was. war:"

Thus Allen W. Dulles, the 73 year-old man who served lor gest as director of the Central Intelligence Agency, tonight justified use of CIA funds to courter Soviet activity among the world's student groups.

He recalled that in the carly post-war era the Soviet Union was spending large sums on student front organizations which organized in Eastern Europe many world youth festivals.

Such festivals, attended by large delegations from the Soviet Union, drew youngsters rot only from Western Europe, but from the emerging nations of Asia and Africa. In many cases the Kremlin picked up the for such travel.

It was a costly proposition for American college youth to cross the ocean and attend affairs this kind, and American vie points often were unrepresented or represented only by Americans with a Russian travel sub sidy.

Private Financing Private foundations, it said, were chary about financ ing trips abroad and related ac tivities by American youth, be-lieving it was "political" and that it might put in jeopardy other work by the foundations.

"Are we to leave the whole field entirely to the Russians?" Dulles asked.

"That's when President Trunan, and President Eisenhower ealized how serious was the Soiet pressure against the Westrn world. That's when we had the Truman program to save. Greece and Turkey and the Marshall Plan to rehabilitate nd save Europe.

"Worth Every Penny" "If we had sat down and done nothing in those days, where vould we be today. I think what ve did was worth every penny:

"If we turned back the Communists and made them milder and casier to live with, it was because we stopped them in certain areas and the student area was one of them."

Dulles entered the CIA as deputy director in 1951, serving in that capacity under W. Bedell

Although President Kennedy acknowledged full responsibility for that affair, some of his White House licutenants freely bandied about Dulles's name it an effort to absolve the Pres ident and themselves of blame.

The Two Dulleses " Dulles is a brother of the late John Foster Dulles, who was Eisenhower's Secretary of Stat and was noted for the very firn line he took against internation al Communist activity.

Schator McCarthy (D., Minn. suggested today, as he proposed a special Senate inquiry into CIA involvement with student and other domestic groups, that the role of the big intelligence agency had "become confused" when the two Dulleses were serving in their respective posts.

There has long been a school of thought in Congress and elsewhere that the CIA role should have been confined solely to colection of intelligence.
