Change at the head of the Central Intelligence Agency, with **Richard**

Helms taking over from Vice Admiral William F. Raborn, will not end the Senate fight over whether Senator Fulbright's Foreign Relations Committee is to have a watchdog role over the CIA.

Richard Helms is described as a professional who comes from the operational side of intelligence work in the CIA, the side that is most in controversy. Asked whether Helms is a "hawk" or a "dove," the informed reply was: "There are no 'doves' in CIA. The professionals look at a problem. If it can be handled they handle it. If odds are against it, they leave it alone. Like the military, they take orders."
