CPYRIGHT **OPERATION MOB RULE**

The Senate Internal Security subcommittee has just released some testimony given it last June by Lyman B. Kirkpatrick Jr., inspector general of the Central Intelligence Agency.

Mr. Kirkpatrick told of, and showed the subcommittee, a Communist handbook, snatched somewhere in Europe by the CIA, on how Reds can most effectively manipulate street mobs and paralyze or hamper police maneuvers to bring mobs under control.
