## Senate Unit Releases Red Handbook Details

A Communist handbook showing how to use a mob to engulf opposing police is described in testimony made public by the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee.

The description was given by Lyman B. Kirkpatrick, Jr., inspector general of the Central Intelligence Agency, at a closed door hearing before the subcommittee last June 12.

The subcommittee did not explain why it waited until

yesterday to release a printed transcript of his testimony, illustrated with charts copied from the manual showing how to "handle" the police.

Mr. Kirkpatrick said Communists and police are natural enemies. He said the manual, seized in Europe, gave detailed instructions on methods to infiltrate the police and wage riots against them, designed to discredit law enforcement in the eyes of the people.

He also told of a tactic in

which Red leaders link arms after starting a riot and thus make the police appear the aggressors.

Communists who fight the police are "fanatical, disciplined and skilled in underground methods," Mr. Kirkpatrick said, but nevertheless no match for loyal, properly trained and equipped police.

He said the United States is helping police in 26 countries, providing modern equipment and technique.
