We are delighted to learn from Mrs. Milbank that you would be able to attend and speak to our forthcoming annual conference at Asilomar which will be held the week end of . May 6-8. I am writing you now to confirm the invitation on behalf of the World Affairs Council of Northern California,

The theme of the conference will be "Competitive Co-Existence -- The Dilemma of the 60's," It is my understanding that you would be prepared to speak on the subject "Competitive ComExistence and Africa. It would also be helpful in our relationship with the press if you could submit an advance text of your talk prior to the conference.
