Dear Mr. Kirkpatrick:

We are delighted to learn from Mrs. Milbank that you would be able to attend and speak to our forthcoming annual conference at Astilomar which will be held the week end of May 6-8. I am writing you now to confirm the invitation on behalf of the World Affairs Council of Northern California.

The theme of the conference will be "Competitive Co-Existence -- The Dilemma of the 60's." It is my understanding that you would be prepared to speak on the subject "Competitive Co-Existence and Africa." That subject will be very appropriate to the general session theme. The program will have four general sessions open to the entire membership of the conference and a session devoted to round-table meetings which will be organized on the basis of several different subjects. We are now in the process of completing the details of the program and I am therefore unable at this moment to indicate just when we would schedule your address. I will send you shortly an outline of the entire program so that you will know the fields to be covered by other speakers. You will be interested to know that the speakers who have accepted thusfar include Walter W. Rostow, [redacted], Dean Rusk, and Richard

[redacted] The conference will also have as their guests Their Majesties the King and Queen of Nepal and the members of their party who are stopping at the conference on their way home after their official visit in Washington with the President.

In addition to your address at a general session, we would like to have you serve as a member of a panel of resource persons at the round-table session on the general subject of "Competition for Development of the Southern Hemisphere." We would also want you to participate in a Sunday morning session of a panel composed of all the speakers for discussing questions submitted by the general conference members.

As for the length of your address at the general session, I suggest that you plan for approximately 30 minutes.

The conference program begins with the general session Friday evening, May 6, and continues through Sunday luncheon, May 8. On Saturday evening the members of the Board of Trustees of the Council will have a private informal dinner for Their Majesties the King and Queen of Nepal at the Del Monte Lodge. The Trustees would like also to have the speakers of the general sessions as guests at that dinner.

It would be helpful to us if you could send us at the earliest moment possible an up-to-date biographical statement together with a glossy print which we may use for publicity purposes. It would also be helpful in our relationship with the press if you could submit an advance text of your talk prior to the conference.

We look forward to having you with us at the conference and will send additional information in the next few days.
