

Paul to Succeed Runge at Defense

President Kennedy today accepted the resignation of Carlisle P. Runge as Assistant Secretary of Defense for Manpower and named Norman S. Paul to succeed him.

Mr. Paul, 43, now is an assistant to the Secretary of Defense. He has served the Government in various capacities since 1948, including service with the Central Intelligence Agency from 1955 to 1960.

Mr. Runge wrote the President that he was resigning to return to professional life in Wisconsin. The President wrote him that he accepted his resignation "only with considerable regret and reluctance."
