He wrote that he had expected to be released last June, bit didn't explain why he wasn't.

Mr. Buol, then chief of flying operations for Civil Air Transport—operated by retired Mij. Gen. Claire L. Chennault—wis on a business trip to Mengtsz in Yunnan province January 1950, when the Reds captured the city.
