## LaVern W. Burrows, Officer In U.S. Embassy in Paris

LaVern W. Burrows, 48, a State Department administrative officer in Paris, died of an apparent heart attack last Wednesday.

Mr. Burrows had been assigned to the American Embassy staff in Paris since the summer of 1965. He transferred there after three years as an attache at the American Embassy in Vienna, Austria.

He came to Washington in 1951, working as a personnel officer for the Army Department until his appointment to Vienna in 1962.

His career as a personnel and administrative officer began in his home town of Battle Creek, Mich., with the Kellogg

Co. He worked for the concern after his graduation from Michigan State University in 1941, returning to be placement director from 1946 until 1951 after his military service.

Mr. Burrows was active in the Episcopal Church. He was a member of the vestry of St. Clements Church in Alexandria before his European service, when he lived at 5916 N. 5th Road, Arlington, Va. He was active in the American Pro-Cathedral in Paris.

He leaves his wife, Helen; two daughters, Jane and Mar-

garet; his mother, Mrs. Lavina Halstead; a brother, Robert, and a sister, Mrs. Donald Schock, all of Battle Creek, Mich.

Services have tentatively been set for 12:45 p.m. Friday at St. Clements Church, 1701 N. Quaker Lane, Alexandria, with burial to follow at Arlington Cemetery.
