**CHESTER W. CLARK,  
HISTORIAN, WAS 64**

Chester Wells Clark of Washington, a historian, died Sunday at the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, Md., after a long illness. He was 64 years old.

Mr. Clark, who entered Government service in 1949, was a member of the editorial board of the Journal of Central European Affairs. He received B. A. and M. A. degrees from the University of Michigan and a Ph. D. degree in history from Harvard University, which had earlier appointed him a Parker Fellow in History.

He later went to Germany, where he studied at the University of Berlin and did research in historical archives. His book, "Franz Joseph and Bismarck," was published by the Harvard University Press as part of the Harvard Historical Studies.

Surviving are his widow, Gertrude, and a sister, Mrs. Stanley Newhall of Louisville, Ky.
