CIA Personnel Officer Heart Attack Victim

Henry C. Clinkscale, 49, of 6320 Highland St., a personnel officer of the Central Intelligence Agency, died unexpectedly Wednesday in Doctors Hospital, Washington.

Mr. Clinkscale was a native of Washington, but had spent most of his life in Alexandria.

During his 15 years with CIA he held responsible positions in the Office of Personnel and was widely known and respected within the agency.

Before joining CIA in 1947 Mr. Clinkscale worked in other government agencies, including the Veterans Administration, the Railroad Retirement Board and the War Production Board.

He also was in the United States Army from 1943 to 1946 engaging in personnel and administrative duties in this country and in the Pacific area.

Among his other interests were the activities of the Old Dominion Boat Club. He was a graduate of the old Alexandria High School.

Mr. Clinkscale is survived by his wife, Helen M. of the home address; by a sister, Mrs. Louis L. Owen, and a brother, Chester C. Clinkscale of Madiera Beach, Fla.
