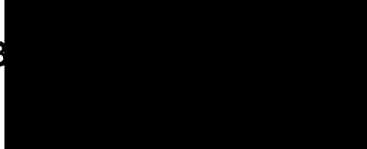

# Green Leaves Air Brake For Own Firm

## Big Drum Picks Somerset For Consolidated Operation

Edward J. Green is leaving Westinghouse Air Brake to form a counseling firm here.

Vice president for planning and marketing at WABCO since 1959, he has set up Edward J. Green Associates in Gateway Towers to specialize in counseling (as opposed to consulting) in the areas of innovation growth and diversification.

The firm will be associated with specialists in other major cities and Mr. Green will continue his association with WABCO as a staff consultant, on a part-time basis, and as supervisor of Air Brake's operational planning program.

School of Public and International Affairs. Mr. Green served with the U. S. Navy, Office of Strategic Services, State Department and Central Intelligence Agency.

He was a personal assistant to General Eisenhower during the 1952 presidential campaign and joined WABCO a year later as executive assistant to the president.

Mr. Green also is authoring an executive manual on planning for the American Management Assn. and is on the Industrial Advisory Council, Long Range Planning Service, at Stanford Research Institute.
